The four groups included in the study are: Criminal Justice Affected (CJS), Domestic Abuse and Sexual Violence Survivors (DASV), Disability and Long-term Health Condition (DHC) and Refugees and Asylum-Seekers Facing Destitution (RAD).

### Numbers:

As of the end of October 2020, we completed around **140** interviews, nearly **90** prisoner surveys and letters and over **60** organisational responses = **290** unique sources of qualitative information, in addition to secondary data from **20** partners. Participants and data came from all over Scotland, the majority from central belt of Scotland.

### Organisational survey:

**63** organisations working with one or more populations above answered questions about: finances, services, impact on own staff, issues affecting populations, positives and messages to policy makers.
